COME TO ONE OF OUR EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Educational programs to be held throughout the province in fall 2010 will include a morning workshop followed by a visit to a nearby woodlot for a look at uneven-aged management as it is being practiced “on the ground”. Sessions will include information on ecosystem-based management, selection harvesting, how to select trees for harvest or retention, crop tree release, and crop tree pruning.
